The recognition of Life Members and 50 and 25 year members is a tribute to the loyalty of members contributing to the Concordia Club ethos.

I would also like to acknowledge that Concordia prides itself for our hardworking Committee, our staff and our very much valued Volunteers. It is with enormous gratitude that I thank all those who have served the Club in these capacities past and present.





# Bundestagswahlen - 26 September 2021

#### **GERMAN ELECTIONS 2021**

Deutsche, die außerhalb der Bundesrepublik Deutschland leben und dort keine Wohnung mehr innehaben, können grundsätzlich an der Wahl teilnehmen.

#### Wer darf wählen?

Sie haben das 14. Lebensjahr vollendet und **mindestens 3 Monate** ununterbrochen in Deutschland gelebt und dieser Aufenthalt liegt nicht mehr als **25 Jahre** zurück.

Oder Sie haben aus anderen Gründen persönlich und unmittelbar Vertrautheit mit den politischen Verhältnissen in Deutschland erworben und sind von ihnen betroffen.

### Wahlberechtigt, was tun?

- 1. Einen schriftlichen Antrag auf Eintragung in das Wählerverzeichnis bei der zuständigen Gemeinde bis spätestens am 5. September 2021 (Posteingang) stellen. Das ist die Gemeinde, wo Sie zuletzt mindestens 3 Monate ununterbochen gelebt haben.
- 2. Dieser Antrag muss persönlich unterschrieben und per Post an das Wahlamt der Gemeinde geschickt werden. Briefe nach Deutschland dauern z.Z. bis zu 25 Tage.

- **3.** Auf die Zusendung der Wahlunterlagen warten. Eine Briefsendung nach Australien dauert z.Z. bis zu 14 Tage.
- 4. Sind die Briefwahlunterlagen angekommen, können Sie diese ausfüllen
  und and das Wahlamt der zuständigen
  Gemeinde zurückschicken. Das
  dauert, wie schon erwähnt z.Z. ca.
  25 Tage. Der Wahlbrief muss am
  Wahlsonntag dem 26.September
  2021 bis 18 Uhr vorliegen.

Oder Sie stellen sicher, dass Ihre ausgefüllten Briefwahlunterlagen bis spätestens am 6. September 2021 bei der Deutschen Botschaft Canberra oder dem Deutschen Generalkonsulat Sydney eingehen. # Ralf's Soljanka Recipe

Soljanka is a thick, spicy and sour soup that is very common in Russia. Soljanka is also popular in the eastern part of Germany where it is commonly found in restaurants and available in supermarkets. German Chancellor Angela Merkel says that Soljanka is one of her favourite foods. This German Soljanka recipe has a hearty, savoury, tad bit spicy and little bit sour flavour which makes it an incredibly comforting and satisfying experience.

### Ingredients

1 tablespoon of olive oil1 large onion, finely chopped2 medium carrots, shredded2 celery stalks, chopped

1 green and red Capsicum, chopped Ham, cubed (1/2 cup)

Smoked sausage, cubed (1/2 cup) Cooked chicken (or turkey) breast, cubed (1/2 cup)

4 slices of bacon, chopped

1 can of diced tomatoes

8 cups chicken stock

2 teaspoons capers, rinsed

3 pickled gherkins, chopped

1 cup pickle juice

1 bay leaf, salt, pepper & black olives, halved

Fresh dill, finely chopped, sour cream chilli (as much or as little as you like)

#### Instructions

Heat olive oil in a medium pot over medium heat.

Add onions, carrots, capsicum and celery and sauté for about 2 minutes.

Add the meats and cook for about 5

Add tomatoes, continue to stir.

minutes stirring occasionally.

Add the chicken stock and bring to a boil, boil for about 20 minutes on medium heat.

Add bay leaf, pickles and pickle juice and continue cooking for another 5 minutes (Spice lovers can add some chillies here).

Add chopped olives, salt and pepper to your taste.

Sprinkle with chopped dill and serve with a dollop of sour cream.

A perfect soup for the cooler months.
