Elisabeth was a caring individual who had, as the French say, a '*Joie de Vivre*' - Joy of Living. Although life was not always kind to Elisabeth, her smile and gracious gratitude for her situation, her ability to see the glass half full not half empty, was a lifestyle she embraced with passion.

Elisabeth became a member of Concordia Club on 28-4-1989 and enjoyed membership in the table tennis sub-group for many years. In 2006 she joined the Committee as a Director and in 2007 and 2008 she served as Vice President. During this time Elisabeth ran the Cake Stall and decorated the Club with plants, curtains and costume dolls, and generally cared for the staff. She was awarded Life Membership in 2010 and her contribution to the Club lives on today, as the Cake Stall was appropriately named after her.

Caring for Alain, Patrick as a young boy, and having Ruth's friendship, gave her the biggest joy. To picture Elisabeth you would see a beautiful tiny blonde woman skipping around the Club dancing with the man she loved most, taking photos and generally making the lives of those she came in contact with the richer with her smile

and happiness. She could cheer the darkest souls and when things were not right she would raise her tiny fist and state her case. She was not afraid of anyone.

Elisabeth and Alain moved to Wentworth Falls in 2014 inviting their many friends to visit them in their cosy home in the mountains. She enriched the lives of many, as we all have our own fond memories of her.

Remembering Rosemarie Scheidl

LIFE MEMBER OF THE CONCORDIA CLUB

Rosemarie was born in May 1934, in Hornberg, Germany, in the depths of the Black Forest, where she lived until 1948. She was an only child, with loving parents, always out-going, cheerful and adventurous. These traits stayed with her throughout her life.

When her father decided to migrate to Australia after the war, it was not a popular choice for Rosemarie who threatened to remain in Germany. She was overruled and in 1950 they boarded the ship, spending at least 2 months at sea traversing the world, including through the Suez Canal, to land first in Hobart, then Melbourne and finally Sydney.

Life in Sydney was very different from what she was used to. She maintained her ties to her beloved Germany, insisted that she would ONLY marry a German man, wrote prolifically to her multitude of relatives and friends back home.

Rosemarie sought out the German Church in Goulburn Street and the German Concordia Club. She joined the Concordia Youth Group, making new friends, some of which lasted the remainder of her life. She loved the outings, balls and festivals. When she first joined the Concordia Club, ladies

were only allowed to be associate members adjoined to their husbands.

In the intervening years, Rosemarie raised a family of 2 children with her GERMAN husband, Helmut, took pride in having 5 grandchildren and 3 great-grandchildren.

Rosemarie loved the Concordia Club! She loved the fact that the Club at Tempe was closer and that she could help out on the Cake Stall, that she could meet old friends and make new ones. She laughed and told stories, reminisced and soaked up the welcoming, caring atmosphere. It was her bit of Germany that she continued to crave even after almost 72 years in Australia.

Rosmarie passed away on Saturday 5 February 2022 at the age of 87 years. Please remember her with kindness and a smile on your faces.

Flammekueche Recipe

Ingredients

Dough

200 g white plain flour

120 ml water* (luke warm in Winter)

Large pinch salt

1 tbsp olive oil

*Every flour is different so the water quantity will vary but the dough should be much firmer than normal bread dough.

Base sauce

125 g crème fraiche/sour cream (1/2 tub)

Fresh herbs (what is to hand - thyme, basil, parsley work well)

Garlic (small clove grated) optional

Squeezed lime/lemon juice optional

Salt and pepper to taste

Toppings

Whatever you want ...

Traditional toppings include:

Smoked salmon with capers and white onion (thinly sliced) and cheese

- Bacon/speck (diced), white onion (thinly sliced) and cheese

Directions

Make dough at least 3 hours prior to cooking.

- Mix together all ingredients in a bowl (electric mixer preferred as it is a stiff dough). Mix until well combined and rest for 2 hours.
- Once rested divide the dough into TWO separate balls and rest again for 30 min.

- Roll it out flat and rest it again for 15 min.
- Roll the dough out further so it is as thin as possible. This will allow gluten to rest and it will not shrink as much when cooking.
- Preheat the oven as hot as possible. For best results use a pizza stone.
- To make the sauce add the fresh herbs, garlic, juice and salt and pepper to the crème fraiche or sour cream and mix well.
- Spread the base sauce thinly and add toppings (not too much, keep it light).
- Bake for 2-5 min depending on oven.
- Slice into squares.

Do not make more than double quantity of the recipe in a home mixer as it might overwork the motor due to the tightness of the dough.
